## Eggs

The queen bee lays eggs in each cell inside a honeycomb. These fertilized eggs will become female workers, unfertilized eggs will become drone bees. Bee eggs measure 1 - 1.5 mm. After three days, the eggs hatch.



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## Queen Bee

The queen bee is the biggest and longest bee in a bee hive. She can live up to five years and is the only bee that lays eggs, up to 2,500 eggs per day. The queen bee has a stinger and can sting many times without dying. While still a growing larva, a queen bee is fed royal jelly which is made by the worker bees. The queen bee is the only one to receive this special food.

## Pupa

This is the stage where transformations take place. The pupa develops eyes, legs and wings. The coloration happens. Fine hairs that cover the body develop. After 12 days the adult bee chews through the capping to join the rest of the hive.



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## Hives

A natural beehive is the nest of any bee colony that they use to protect themselves, store food, and raise their young in. Internally, the structure contains a densely packed group of hexagonal cells, made from beeswax. These cells are used to store food and house their young.



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## Worker Bees

are all female. They work around the hive as they collect pollen and nectar from flowers outside the hive. They use their stinger, and if they die, they will die.
